The students also greatly enjoyed seeing all of Mishka's

Mishka was so loved by the students and teachers. There was even a day when a 4th grade class threw Mishka a birthday party, complete with a doggy birthday banner and homemade cards! My heart was melting as Mishka had a huge smile on her face while taking pictures with every single student in the class. Mishka's smile and spirit was so infectious, that students who were having a hard morning would immediately perk up after a few pets with Mishka.
